# CMS Invites Comments on Proposed Rule for Medicare Advantage and Part D

On February 5, 2019, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) posted a new notice of proposed rulemaking for Medicare Advantage and Part D (see also the accompanying fact sheet). CMS also released the Advance Notice Part II and fact sheet). CMS will accept comments on all proposals in the Advance Notice through **Friday, March 6, 2020**, before publishing the final Rate Announcement by April 6, 2020. To submit comments or questions electronically, go to https://www.regulations.gov/, enter the docket number "CMS-2020-0003" in the "search" field, and follow the instructions for "submitting a comment."

### Preadmission Screening and Resident Review (PASRR) Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM)

On February 14, Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) released a <u>Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM)</u> to propose revised regulations for Preadmission Screening and Resident Review (PASRR). Proposed changes to the PASRR regulations contained in this NPRM include: updating PASRR-specific definitions of MI and ID; streamlining the Preadmission Screening process; implementing statutory changes to the Resident Review requirements that are not reflected in current regulations; authorizing the use of telehealth technology; simplifying the list of information that must be collected during evaluations; clarifying that Federal Financial Participation (FFP) is available for specialized services;

placing greater emphasis on the role of the individual's preference for where to receive long-term services; and clarifying state PASRR programs' federal reporting obligations.

### February 2020 Enrollment in Medicare-Medicaid Plans

Between January 2020 and February 2020, total Medicare-Medicaid Plan enrollment in the nine states (CA, IL, MA, MI, NY, OH, RI, SC, and TX) currently implementing capitated model demonstrations under the Financial Alignment Initiative increased from 385,959 to 386,331 as shown in ICRC's table <u>Monthly Enrollment in Medicare-Medicaid</u> <u>Plans by Plan and by State, February 2019 to February 2020</u>.

### February 2020 Enrollment in PACE Organizations

PACE organizations provide comprehensive medical and social services to frail, community-dwelling individuals age 55 and older, most of whom are Medicare-Medicaid enrollees. As shown in ICRC's table, <u>Program of All Inclusive</u> <u>Care for the Elderly (PACE) Total Enrollment by State and by Organization</u>, PACE organizations were operating in 31 states in February 2020. Between January 2020 and February 2020, the total number of Medicare beneficiaries enrolled in PACE increased from 48,581 to 48,934.
